Ireland's greenest teens celebrated at the 20th anniversary of the Young Environmentalist Awards

Ireland's greenest teens were honoured at the national showcase and awards ceremony of the ECO-UNESCO Young Environmentalist Awards (YEA), which took place on May 23rd 2019 at the Convention Centre Dublin. At the awards ceremony, hosted by Taz and Geraldine from Sustainable Fashion Dubin, projects across a wide range of innovative environmental themes, designed and put into action by young people from across the island of Ireland, were selected as winners.

The YEA programme run by ECO-UNESCO has provided over **50,000 young people**, aged 10-18, an opportunity to take action and raise awareness in their own community on sustainability and environmental issues that matter the most to them, since it began in 1999.

Following a hugely successful event last year where we celebrated the 20th Anniversary of the Young Environmental Awards, YEA 2020 promises to be another exciting and rewarding programme. The YEA is an all-Ireland environmental awards programme that recognises and rewards young people who raise environmental awareness and improve the environment.

It is a fun and exciting way to empower young people to become better citizens, to build awareness of environmental issues in the community and promote local actions and lifestyle changes to improve the environment.

How do the awards work?

- 1. Interested groups register online.
- 2.Registered groups can avail of the '6 Steps to Success' training programme.
- 3. Groups submit their ECO-Action projects.
- 4. Internal judging panels assess all registered projects and create a shortlist.
- 5. Shortlisted groups are invited to pitch their projects to a panel of expert regional judges at ECO-DENS.
- 6. Finalists showcase their project at YEA Gala Showcase and Awards Ceremony.

Who can enter?

ECO-UNESCO's Young Environmentalist Awards programme is open to any group of young people in the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland from 10-18 years of age.

Bringing Education for Sustainable Development Education to Schools

"Learning2Change Our World" is an inspiring and engaging secondary school programme that works with teachers and students alike to develop knowledge of Development Education and practices in Sustainable Development.

In the 2018/2019 term we worked with **28 schools** to deliver **40 workshops** 8 student council training sessions and a 6-week TY module. In total we reached **1,032 participants**.

Thanks to the energy and passion of the participants we meet all across the country, we have seen a 40% signup rate of schools participating in our Learning2Change programme to the Young Environmentalist Awards, including several that went on to become winners in their respective categories.

ECO-UNESCO's Green Teen. Summer Camp.

ECO-UNESCO's Green Teen Summer Camp ran from June 24th - July 1st in 2019. Due to the increased popular demand of our Teen Camps this year, we ran them over two weeks in July and August, with 31 young people taking part.

The camps included a mix of interactive workshops and outdoor education. Participants learned about the important role sharks play in our ocean's ecosystems; a critical pollinators workshop which looked at the delicate roll bees play in our lives and why it's more important than ever to protect them; and also held a clothes swap along with facilitated debates on fast fashion and the devastating impact our unsustainable clothing has on the natural environment.
