Director's Message


Dear ECO-UNESCO's friends,

 4. Internal judging panels assess all registered projects and create a shortlist.
 5. Shortlisted groups are invited to pitch their projects to a panel of expert regional judges at ECO-DENS.
 6. Finalists showcase their project at YEA Gala Showcase and Awards Ceremony.

Youth Action for Nature & Well-being

The Youth Action for Nature and Well-being is a strategic partnership between 6 European organisations, led by ECO-UNESCO that aims to innovate new ways of working with young people that combine transformative learning, action competence and nature-based strategies for positive mental health. We will work to empower young people by equipping them with the skills to restore their environment and engage with society as active citizens to influence their future.

We will be running 4 international pilots in Ireland, Spain, Latvia, and Slovakia.

Registrations will be open in February 2022.

So much happened in ECO-UNESCO in 2021 and throughout the year we continued to engage, educate, inspire and empower young people to take action around environmental issues.

We want to share with you and celebrate all we accomplished last year.

ECO-UNESCO's YOUTH PROGRAMMES 2021

YSD 6-week programme

In 2021 YSD ran weekly groups in Drogheda, Dublin, and our YSD National group which consists of people from different regions of the country.

During the Summer we ran Summer Camps in Dublin, with Boomerang Drogheda, Croabh Rua Dundalk, and with Youth Reach Bandon.

Youth Climate Justice Challenge

A consortium of 5 youth organisations, led by ECO-UNESCO ran the second Youth Climate Justice Challenge, with partners Gaisce The President Award, The No Name Club, Irish Girls Guides & Young Irish Film Makers. The Youth Climate Justice Programme received 14 environmental projects from across Ireland.

Climate Justice Survey

ECO-UNESCO in collaboration with SpunOut.ie, conducted an online survey with young people. The purpose of the survey was to highlight how young people of Ireland feel about climate change and climate justice issues. You can read the full Youth Climate Action Survey Results www.ecounesco.ie

ECO-Weeks

In 2021 we celebrated 4 ECO-Weeks focused on:

The ECO-Weeks is a week-long initiative that includes a series of environmental events for young people. These events took place as online webinars, talks, workshops, and challenges.

ECO-UNESCO's CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMMES 2021

Erasmus+ Strategic Partnership

Midway through 2021, we commenced an Erasmus+ funded project called "Youth Action for Nature and Wellbeing", a 26-month long programme to examine and understand the role nature plays in physical and mental wellbeing, combined with the production of resources, case studies, and e-learning content that practitioners can use to embed the natural environment in their teaching practices. We are proud to be working with partner organisations in the UK, Spain, Latvia, and Slovakia on this project.

Environmental Workshops

In 2021, our workshop programme was very popular and we expanded our range of online live and pre-recorded workshops which included fast fashion, climate action, YEA 6 Steps among others. Our workshops are available to schools and youth groups and include fun activities and games appropriately designed for each age group.

e-Learning and Online Education

In 2021 we expanded our e-learning capability to include self-directed courses using a platform called LearnDash. This will allow learners to access course material on key environmental issues such as Climate Justice and learn at their own pace.

Additional content will be added throughout 2022.

ECO-Choices - Health & Wellbeing

Throughout 2021, the ECO-Choices programme continued to engage young people in Dublin.

Early in the year, we had participants complete a QQI Level 3 in Community Participation.

We currently have 4 more groups participating in our QQI Community Participation course and can't wait to see the projects they have been working on in the new year!

ECO-Choices also ran weekly groups with 'The Sandy Feds' and 'Spill the Tea'. These youth groups offered support to our young people and provided a space for them to talk about any difficulties they may be having - all while creating a virtual youth space to catch up with friends.

As well as our weekly online sessions, we also enjoyed meeting with our participants for outdoor education days!

Young Environmentalists Take Action through the Young Environmentalist Awards 2021

On the 26th of May 2021, ECO-UNESCO celebrated the Young Environmentalist Awards 2021.

The awards ceremony was hosted online and was part of the ECO-WEEK initiative, a week-long event that included a series of online events focused on environmental topics as Fast Fashion, Marine life, Biodiversity, Plastic, and much more.

The YEA online ceremony took place in a Live transmission through ECO-UNESCO's YouTube channel. The awards ceremony was opened by the President of Ireland, Michael D. Higgins, and the former President of Ireland, Mary Robinson. The awards were hosted by the TV Presenter Clara Murray.

The YEA programme run by ECO-UNESCO has provided over **50,000 young people**, aged 10-18, an opportunity to take action and raise awareness in their own community on sustainability and environmental issues that matter the most to them since it began in 1999.
